Frequently Asked Questions—For Foreign Charitable Organizations

Who is CAF America?

Charities Aid Foundation of America (CAF America) is an independent, US 501(c)(3) public charity whose mission is to increase the flow of charitable funds outside the US. Founded in 1992, CAF America is a member of the CAF Alliance with offices and partner organizations in the United Kingdom, Australia, India, Russia, Bulgaria, Singapore, South Africa, and Brazil. CAF America makes an average of 1,500 grants annually, totaling more than \$300 million since 2001 alone, to legitimate foreign charitable organizations in over 90 countries around the world. We enable Americans to give safely, knowledgeably, and securely overseas and offer them international grantmaking and advisory services. Many different types of donors use CAF America's giving solutions including individuals, companies and their employees, families and foundations.

How does CAF America work?

American donors cannot give directly to foreign charitable organizations and obtain a tax-deduction. As a US public charity, CAF America is able to accept funds from American donors who can then recommend that CAF America use those funds to support a foreign organization.

Why has CAF America contacted me?

CAF America has contacted your organization because a US donor has suggested that CAF America make a grant to you. CAF America has to assess your organization under US law to determine that your organization is a legitimate foreign charitable organization and will use any grant from us exclusively for charitable purposes. We will undertake all necessary due diligence to be compliant with US laws and any additional checks we think are necessary to ensure safe international grantmaking.

How does my organization become eligible to receive grants from CAF America?

Any legitimate foreign charitable organization can apply to become eligible with CAF America. You do not have to be suggested by a US donor to do so. If your organization has not been suggested by a donor, the application review cost is \$500 USD. The application process is as follows:

1. Submit a complete, signed eligibility application form.

When a grant suggestion is made by a donor, CAF America sends your organization a Grant Eligibility Application (GEA). The application has a grant agreement attached which you will need to sign. We also ask you to supply a number of documents to support your application. Please complete and sign the GEA, supply all the documents requested and send them to CAF America. Please complete all sections of the GEA in full even if the information requested can be found in the supporting documentation. You may attach additional sheets if you need more space to answer questions.

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2. Supply the additional documentation CAF America needs.

CAF America requires the following information in order to consider a foreign organization for eligibility to receive grants. Please see the list below for the exact documents we require you to submit to us, and please read these details and any notes carefully as they will answer many of your questions.

- **Governing documents.** This can be a constitution, by laws, trust deed, memorandum and articles of association, or other organizing documents that describe how the charity is structured and governed. We need both an original language copy and an English translation.*
- **Dissolution provision.** If this is not part of the governing documents we need a statement of what will happen to the funds if the charity is dissolved. Dissolution provision must be in English.*
- **Director selection process.** If this is not part of the governing documents we need a statement describing the process by which directors and/or trustees are chosen. Director selection process must be in English.*
- **Financial documents.** We prefer to review your most recent audited financial statement. We will review a copy of an un-audited statement if you are not required by law to produce an audited financial statement. If you cannot supply a financial statement we ask you to provide a record of your charity's income and expenditures. This could include bank statements, accounting records, or other financial documents and a written narrative explaining the financial position of the charity. If your charity is in the process of establishing itself and does not yet have financial records we will need a detailed budget projection for the upcoming year and will ask for financial statements for the first year of operation. Financial statements must be in English.*
- **Independent verification of mission.** This could be an annual report, brochure, website, fundraising material, or any other document that describes the charity's mission/purpose. This does not need to be in English.
- **List of current directors and/or trustees.** Please provide a first name, middle initial and last name.
- **Proof of charitable or not-for-profit status** in the organization's country of residence. We require both an original language copy and an English translation.*

* English translations do not have to be formal, professionally commissioned, or notarized.

3. CAF America reviews your application.

Once CAF America receives your completed, signed GEA and supporting documents we begin an extensive review of your organization. We are required to do this by law. In recent years, CAF America has strengthened its grants administration procedures in line with US laws and good international grantmaking practices. Our procedures are in place to reduce the risk of grants being diverted illegally. Our review of your application checks various aspects of your organization's finances and operations. We look at structure and governance, financial health, non-for-profit status, goals, programs, and how grants would be used.



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4. How long does it take?

From the date we receive the completed, signed GEA and supporting documentation, application review generally takes between 4-6 weeks. It can take much longer if the GEA is incomplete or we do not receive all the required supporting documentation. If you are approved for eligibility we will send a letter of confirmation, a copy of the countersigned grant agreement, and a gift form to distribute to your donors. During your eligibility period, you may receive grants at any time from CAF America and do not need to reapply for eligibility for each grant received.

Notes on completing eligibility:

- a. By signing the written grant agreement within the GEA you agree to comply in full with CAF America terms and conditions of eligibility, US law and use of any grant received from CAF America.
- b. If we have any questions, or need any additional information we will contact you by email; please provide an accurate email address on the GEA.
- c. We understand that small organizations may not have access to an English speaker who can translate the supporting documents. CAF America is required by law to have all documents in English, but translations do not have to be formal, professionally commissioned, or notarized. CAF America can provide fee-based translation services if they are needed.

Does eligibility expire?

Yes. Once granted, eligibility with CAF America lasts for: three years for UK, Australian, and Canadian organizations; two years for organizations all other countries.

What do I do if my organization's eligibility with CAF America expires?

When your organization's eligibility is due to expire, you may renew your eligibility status. You will need to complete and sign a new GEA in full, sign an accompanying addendum asking for verification that none of the organizing documents have changed (or, if they have, you will need to submit any updated documents), and submit your most recent audited financial statement and a current list of directors/trustees.

What else can CAF America do for me?
